Report on the 2018 Mershon Annual Meeting and Reunion

The 2018 annual meeting of the Association of the Descendants of Henry Mershon was called to order on Saturday, July 28th, at 10:15 am in the Community Meeting Room at the Lawrence Headquarters Branch of the Mercer County Library in Lawrenceville, NJ. Following an invocation, we recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Each family group introduced themselves and shared information about their family history.

Mershon Association Annual Meeting & Reunion Lawrenceville, NJ

At 11:00 am, Laura Nawrocik of the Mercer County Library Staff updated us on what is happening with the Mershon archives, now part of the Lawrence Township Archives located at the Mercer County Library. She showed us the lidded redware ceramic jar recently donated to our archives by Virginia Skillman. This jar was probably made by the McCully Pottery in Trenton. Following Laura's presentation, we began our business meeting until 12:00 pm, when we set up for our catered box lunch meal.

Living history program on Abigail Adams (following lunch) –

Abigail Adams was portrayed by Kim Hanley of the American Historical Theater in Philadelphia. Abigail was the wife of John Adams, second President of the United States, and the mother of John Quincy Adams, sixth President of the United States.

Abigail served as an unofficial advisor to her husband. Her biggest causes were education and fairer treatment of women. John Adams was frequently away from home while serving in the Continental Congress during the Revolutionary War. Abigail wrote him from their home in Braintree, Massachusetts, to "remember the women" when enacting new laws. Abigail had the responsibility of running their farm while John was away.

John Adams served as Vice-President under George Washington, then was elected as President in 1797. Because of their close relationship, Abigail was sometimes referred to as "Mrs. President."

The Mershon Association Genealogy Group set up by Pam on Facebook now has 132 members. Our genealogy database has over 35,000 records of Mershon descendants and spouses, from 1685 to present.

Mershon Southern Chapter Report: Wally Riviere of Keystone Heights, FL, reported on the Southern Chapter. He also described his ancestry through William J.I. and Albina Pauline (Mershon) Riviere of Georgia. Wally presented a folder to our Association containing his family information.

Executive Board Report: Our Executive Board met on Friday evening July 27th. Main items considered were-

- Noel Barton has almost finished his paid work organizing and digitizing our Mershon archives. On July 18, Noel shipped five record boxes to the Lawrence Township Archives and one box to Pam Caffrey for incorporation into our genealogical database. One box is still at the LDS Family History Library to be scanned. Our scanned documents are being posted on the Family History Library website at this link - <https://www.familysearch.org/search/catalog/results?count=20&query=%2Bsurname%3Amershon>
- We extended an invitation in our April 2018 News Bulletin for proposals to hold our annual meeting in other locations besides Lawrenceville, perhaps doing this one year out of three. In response, we discussed a proposal by Christine Mershon to hold an annual meeting at the Fall City Farm, 26 miles east of Seattle, WA. This 100 acre farm is in a park like setting with a lodge, close to Snoqualmie Falls. After discussion, we decided to do additional research towards perhaps holding our 2020 meeting at that location. The intent is to make our meeting more available to Mershons' in other parts of our country, to build Mershon friendships and enthusiasm for our family history. We will hold our 2019 meeting in Lawrenceville.

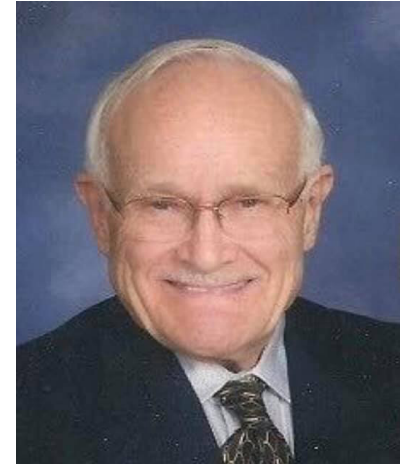

Dr. James C. “Jim” Mershon, MD, of Wichita, KS, age 81, passed away unexpectedly on March 19, 2019. Jim died following a serious fall backward while climbing stairs in his home. He was still breathing after his fall, but never regained consciousness. You may recall that Jim had a previous serious fall with multiple broken bones in December 2017 (see our April 2018 News Bulletin).



Jim served as President of our Mershon Association from approximately 2001 to 2007. He was ably assisted by his wife Beverly who served as Corresponding Secretary during the same period. Among Jim’s many contributions to our Association was establishing our mershonassoc.com website. Jim and Beverly continued to serve on our Mershon Executive Board. Jim and his son Philip attended our 2017 Mershon annual meeting. His enthusiasm for our Mershon Association will be greatly missed. Jim was an Andrew³ descendant.

For privacy reasons, our Genealogist does not release information on living persons outside your immediate family (grandparents, parents, siblings, children, spouses) without their written consent, unless the subject persons would be over 110 years old. This is the guideline followed by the ancestry.com genealogy website.
